BACKGROUND:

Workplace Safety 3220 is a course designed to bridge the gap between school and the workplace. When young people enter the workforce, as employers or employees, they need to know the importance of workplace safety and the effects of workplace accidents upon society.

Workplace Safety 3220 is one of a few courses that will benefit the student, the employer and society as a whole by generating an increased level of safety awareness in the world of work. In this course students will be exposed to “real life” work-related safety issues. Also, students will be afforded an opportunity to be certified in various safety programs to national standards.
